

1 The initial Texas warrant⁶ was issued on April 3, 2008, and described the
2 place to be searched as the YFZ Ranch located at 2420 County Road 300 (Rudd
3 Road), Eldorado, Texas 76936. This describes the location of an entire
4 community including private homes, private businesses, a medical clinic, a
5 Temple, a Temple Annex, a quarry and other buildings indicative of a community
6 structure. The ranch comprises 1,691.11 acres. No particular buildings are named
7 in the initial search warrant. The second search warrant issued on April 6, 2008,
8 just hours before the expiration of time for execution of the first warrant. The
9 second warrant was obtained for places which were already searched but which
10 were not contained in the first search warrant, and for items which were already
11 seized but were not authorized in the first search warrant. The second warrant
12 purported to authorize the search of the Temple (after it had already been
13 searched) and identified cellular phones as items to be seized (which had already
14 been seized but were not authorized as items to be seized in the first search
15 warrant). The law enforcement officers who conducted the raid on the YFZ
16 Ranch also seized items that the court particularly refused to authorize in the
17 search warrant application, including intrusive seizures of blood, bucal cells, and

26 ⁶ There is some evidence that the Texas authorities actually engaged in "judge shopping" when they
27 were unable to secure a warrant from the judge initially contacted. There is conflicting factual
28 evidence on this issue that will need to be resolved as it pertains to the validity of the warrants
eventually obtained.
