**APPLICATION FOR ORDER TO  
SHOW CAUSE**

Pursuant to Rule 7.3 of the Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure, Plaintiff hereby  
applies for the entry of an order to show cause. Rule 7.3 provides:

(a) Generally. A court, on application supported by affidavit showing  
sufficient cause, may issue an order requiring a person to show cause why  
the party applying for the order should not have the relief it requests in its  
application. The court must designate a date by which the person must  
respond, and may set a hearing on the application.

(b) Service. An order to show cause must be served in the same manner that  
a summons and pleading are served under Rule 4, 4.1, or 4.2, as applicable,  
or, if the person to whom the order is directed has entered an appearance in

1 the action, in accordance with Rule 5. Service must be effected within such  
2 time as the court orders.

3 Plaintiffs' Verified Complaint requests a show cause hearing be set and is supported  
4 by a declaration verifying that its contents are true and correct. Thus, it is an application  
5 supported by affidavit under the Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure. *See* Ariz. R. Civ. P.  
6 8(h), 80(c). *See also First Phx. Realty Inv. v. Superior Court*, 173 Ariz. 265, 268 n.7 (App.  
7 1992) (recognizing the "normal equity practice" of supporting an application for an Order  
8 to Show Cause with a verified complaint).

9 Defendants will begin, or have begun, performing illegal and unconstitutional acts  
10 contrary to the Arizona Constitution pursuant to the early voting statutes ("no-excuse mail-  
11 in" voting). Plaintiffs offer to present testimony at the Show Cause hearing that Defendants  
12 have and will continue to violate the Arizona Constitution by implementing  
13 unconstitutional voting procedures in the upcoming general election. Therefore, Plaintiffs  
14 request that the Show Cause hearing be set as immediately as possible so that this issue  
15 can be resolved.
