NOTICE OF REQUIREMENT TO ATTEND CO-PARENTING CLASS

Based on the pleadings filed, it appears there are minor children involved in this matter, and is therefore referred to Conciliation Court Services / Mediation Center.

Pursuant to A.R.S. §25-352 the Petitioner and Respondent are directed as follows:

- 1. ATTEND CLASS. You must complete the Co-Parenting Class provided by the Conciliation Court of Mohave County either in person or on-line. The purpose of the class is to provide you with information about how children are affected by matters that involve the Family Court. The class also provides an overview of (a) the mediation process, (b) legal decision making and (c) parenting time. Class are offered in Kingman, Bullhead City and Lake Havasu City. If there is an Order of Protection, parties are encouraged to attend separate classes. If you have a concern about attending the same class as the co-parent, please inform the Mediation Center when you sign up for the class. The Mediation Center can be reached at 928-753-0795.
- **2. WITHIN 45 DAYS.** Both the Petitioner and the Respondent must complete the Co-Parenting class within 45 days from the date the Respondent is served with the Petition/Complaint. The Petitioner is encouraged to contact the Mediation Center to schedule his/her class after filing the Petition. The Respondent must register for and complete the class whether or not a "Response" or "Answer" to the Petition/Complaint is filed with the court.
- **3. PAY CLASS FEE.** There is a fee to attend the Co-Parenting Class. Each party must pay the class fee to the Clerk of the Superior Court. The Petitioner's class fee is generally included in the filing fee paid at the time of case initiation (in dissolution cases).
- **4. FILE CERTIFICATE OF CLASS COMPLETION**. Once you have completed the Co-Parenting Class, the Mediation Center will file a certificate with the court as proof you have completed the class.
- **5. FAILURE TO COMPLETE CLASS.** If you do not complete the Co-Parenting Class, the judge may not sign your papers and you may not get the things you requested of the court. You may also be denied the right to seek modification and/or enforcement of the decree/judgment/order until completion of the class. If you are the Respondent and choose not to file a "Response" or "Answer," you still need to complete the Co-Parenting Class, or you may be denied the right to seek modification and/or enforcement of the decree/judgment/order until completion of the class.
