IN THE MATTER OF REMOTE  
CIVIL JURY TRIAL EXPANSION  
TO INCLUDE ALL CIVIL CASES

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
2022 - 18

The Court issued Administrative Order No. 2021-23 on May 20, 2021 establishing a remote civil jury trial pilot project. It has now become necessary to expand and clarify that order.

**WHEREAS**, the Presiding Judge of Mohave County, Arizona entered Administrative Order No. 2021-023 on May 20, 2021 assigning Division IV to preside over the remote civil jury trial project as required by Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2021-050.

**WHEREAS**, the Presiding Judge is required to report on the effectiveness of the pilot program in or around October, 2022.


**WHEREAS**, after the issuance of that above administrative order, a considerable time passed without a remote civil jury trial being conducted.

**WHEREAS**, to ensure sufficient data was collected for an adequate report to be made, the Presiding Judge of Mohave County, Arizona on January 18, 2022 entered Administrative Order No. 2022-09 authorizing all civil judges to conduct remote civil jury trials under the pilot program.

**WHEREAS**, even after the issuance of Administrative Order No. 2022-09 a civil remote jury trial as defined by Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2021-050 has yet to occur for a variety of enunciated reasons.

**IT IS ORDERED** confirming that all civil cases pending within the Superior Court in and for the County of Mohave are placed within the remote civil jury trial project subject to the requirements and exceptions set forth within Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2021-050.
