Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 93-30 approves Administrative Rules for appointment of a presiding judge of superior court, a presiding justice of the peace for the justice courts and a presiding municipal court judge for the municipal courts of each county. Mohave County has previously received authorization from the Chief Justice of the Arizona Supreme Court to create the position of presiding limited jurisdiction judge to preside over both municipal courts and justice courts in this county. The most recent order authorizing that position, Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2002-21, has expired by its own limiting provisions.

The justices of the peace and magistrates selected Larry Imus as presiding limited jurisdiction judge in accordance with the provisions of Administrative Order No. 93-30. His term expires December 31, 2004. He has requested that the unique presiding limited jurisdiction judge position not be reinstated, and that he be affirmed as presiding justice of the peace only for the duration of that term.

I have considered the positions of the lower court judges who responded to Judge Imus' request for input. Considering the circumstances presented, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED appointing Larry D. Imus, Justice of the Peace in and for Kingman Precinct, as presiding justice of the peace, effective immediately, through December 31, 2004.
