Arizona Revised Statutes 12-103 requires in counties of two or more justices of the peace that the presiding justice of the peace be elected by a vote of the justices of the peace, and that one alternate be chosen. Prior to the October 14, 2004 Mohave County justice of the peace meeting, a vote for presiding justice of the peace was registered with the court administrator via electronic mail, a record of which is attached. This election reflects a unanimous vote for Judge John S. Taylor.

Additionally, the justices of the peace decided that the presiding justice of the peace shall appoint the alternate presiding justice of the peace to serve during his absence, based on the availability of justices of the peace at the time.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Honorable John S. Taylor, Justice of the Peace of the Cerbat Precinct, be appointed as presiding justice of the peace for Mohave County for the term beginning January 1, 2005 and ending December 31, 2007.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Judge Taylor shall have the authority to appoint an alternate presiding justice of the peace to serve in his absence.
