In accordance with Arizona Code of Judicial Administration, Part 1, Chapter 3, Section 1-305, for selection of special judicial officers, and in furtherance of the needs of the justice courts to have justices of the peace pro tempore to hear cases in the absence of the elected or appointed justices of the peace, IT IS ORDERED:

1. The following persons are hereby appointed as justice of the peace pro tempore for the period from January 1, 2005, through December 31, 2005, to serve in any justice court precinct within Mohave County and to hear or consider any cases or petitions within the jurisdiction of an elected justice of the peace:

2. The following persons are hereby appointed as justice of the peace pro tempore for the period from January 1, 2005, through December 31, 2005, to serve in any justice court precinct within Mohave County and to hear criminal or traffic cases, excluding jury trials, and to consider and conduct hearings for petitions for Orders of Protection or for Injunctions Against Harassment or any other matters that would fall within the jurisdiction of a municipal court judge/magistrate:

> Clyde Andress Patrick Carlin Michael Elder Nelson Meringola

3. Clyde Andress, the Lake Havasu City Magistrate, is also authorized to conduct jury trials as justice of the peace pro tempore upon the request of the Justice of the Peace of any precinct within Mohave County.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that each of these appointed justices of the Peace pro tempore comply fully with any continuing legal education or COJET training requirements established by the presiding judge of superior court or the presiding justice of the peace of Mohave County.
